- 1. The Mountain Home City Council met in regular session October 7th, 2021 in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building. Mayor Hillrey Adams called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a prayer.
- 2. ROLL CALL The following council members were present for the roll call: Nick Reed, Jim Bodenhamer, Jennifer Baker, Susan Stockton, Bob Van Haaren, Wayne Almond and Carry Manual. Paige Evans was absent from the meeting.
- 3. OFFICIALS IN ATTENDANCE Mayor Hillrey Adams, , City Clerk Brian Plumlee, City Attorney Roger Morgan, Treasurer Marshella Norell, Parks & Rec Director Billy D. Austin, and Police Chief Eddie Griffin.
- 4. MINUTES Councilwoman Baker made a motion to approve the council meeting minutes from September 16, 2021. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Stockton. The City Clerk recorded the following vote: 6 yes Reed, Baker, Almond, Stockton, Van Haaren, and Manual; 1 abstain Evans.

**REVIEW OF BIDS RECEIVED FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED ON HWY 5 SOUTH AND AWARD OF SAID BID** – Councilman Bob Van Haaren made a motion to accept the high bid (Kelley Shay - \$18,800), the motion was accepted Councilman Almond. City Clerk Brian recorded the following vote: all present – yes.

9/11 PRESENTATION Tommy Feliccia of the Mountain Home Fire Department and Cheri Smith of the Henderson Fire Department presented the design of the planned 9/11 memorial to the Mountain Home City Council. "I've seen a lot of memorials incorporating pieces of 9/11 steel on Google, but I have not seen one with the steel wedged in between like that," Feliccia said. The display would likely keep a side of the square-cut piece of steel exposed to the viewer, allowing visitors to lay their hands on a piece of American history. "We've been keeping the steel at the fire department, and people come in and just want to touch it," Feliccia said. "It's a powerful thing, being able to touch a piece of the steel that came down that day." When built, the memorial will be just the sixth 9/11 memorial in the state to incorporate a piece of steel from the Twin Towers, and the only one in north central Arkansas. Pieces of steel from the World Trade Center complex are provided by the FDNY and are becoming increasingly harder to procure. Twenty years' worth of requests — plus other endeavors like providing 7.5 tons of steel used in the construction of the U.S.S. New York — have depleted much of the steel salvaged from Ground Zero. The late Vincent Feliccia of Mountain Home, Tommy Feliccia's grandfather, was instrumental in bringing the 50-pound piece of 9/11 steel to the Twin Lakes Area. Vincent Feliccia and Joseph Russo, his brother-in-law, worked with several other New York City officials and residents to request a piece of steel for Mountain Home. "Without my uncle and my grandfather, I think we would have been another request that came in and went right into the trash," Tommy Feliccia said. Like Russo, Vincent Feliccia was a retired FDNY firefighter. "If you ever met my grandfather, he had on an FDNY shirt," Russo said. "He loved his time there in the FDNY." - Liles, Scott. Parks and Recreation City Council Committee Meeting



#### **OCTOBER 2021 Committee Meeting**

10/14/2021 - 5:18PM. Attending: Alma Clark, Jennifer Baker, Bob Van Haaren, Nick Reed, & Kirby Rowland. We met in council chamber. The meeting adjourned at 6:25pm.

- Cash analysis / Revenue / Expense Report ending September 2021 were passed out.
- Project reports for month ending September 2021 passed out.
- Our water loss was 17.1 % Ending September 2021. The previous month was at 20.0%. We continue to fix and find leaks daily.
- Passed out spreadsheet copies to show impact of a 5% sewer increase for 2022. Scenarios were ran for a 2000 gal & 4500 gal residential & commercial users. This spreadsheet did not include the COLA amount which would be added on top of this 5% increase March 2022 for total sewer increase. Water side would just be the COLA % amount. As of ending September, the COLA is 5.8% don't know what it will be by the end of December 2021.
- Passed out copies of scenario spreadsheets for committee & mayor review with regards to the sewer revenue side reflecting deficits for the last 20+ years. Committee has been looking at some possibilities of refinancing the 2020 bond & lengthening the number of years of the bond issue from a 10 year to 20 years to see how this helps with the deficits in the future as we have normally taken short term bonds in the past; this has worked for the water bond side very well because the water department is flush at the moment and not in the deficit. Discussion with committee took place with recommendations to lengthen the bond to 20 years and then make adjustment increases on the sewer side by 5% per year plus the amount of the CPI% or an adjustment to the CPI each year in March of each year when the CPI increase is usually passed by council for both water & sewer residential & commercial users on the system. We will be bringing more data back to committee at the November meeting for committee & mayor review so that a decision might be made as how to proceed. Recommendation to council when a decision is made.
- As part of the refinancing and lengthening the years on the 2020 bond to help fix the sewer rate issue we are still looking into what will be needed for current bonding and additional monies for engineering fees to cover a Change out of the disinfection / dechlorination methods of disinfection to UV disinfection at the wastewater treatment plant. Total approximate cost for the UV project parts, install & engineering would be approximately \$3,100,000.00. Other repairs & replacements are also being looked at by Garver & the sewer department were a total of \$6,050,000.00 includes engineering of the remaining issues. The additional items we considered were replacement of 3 screw pumps, rehab of 2 bar screens with addition of one bar screen, covering of bar screens, washing system/compactor & bagging system, replacement of 4 anoxic mixers, replacement of RAS/WAS VFD's & PLC controls in operations building, replacement of all outside electrical control panels 1-3 that control all electrical components with in the treatment plant. The grand total is \$9,150,000.00 this amount includes engineering for all the projects including UV. We will have some remaining contingency funds approximately \$500,000.00 from current project to use toward these upgrades mentioned + the use of additional bond funds to cover the remaining to make addition funds needed. Committee was in favor of refinancing 2020 bond w/ the addition of another 10 million to do additional rehabilitation work on the wastewater plant.

  I will need vote of council to allow to us to proceed with bond issue at November 4, 2021 council meeting.
- Alma supplied committee with a copy of items that she wants to push to council for approval for disposal at the next council meeting. If approved
  they would be advertised & auctioned at Walker Auction at a later date. I will place this on November 4, 2021 council agenda for a vote.
- Kirby gave updates to the Committee on several things that the water/sewer department is working on: WWTP upgrades, The new Lake intake site, Assessment of Backwash sludge handling at WTP, Possible change in disinfection / De-chlorination chemicals at WWTP.

#### PROJECT UPDATES:

- Hwy 5N WL upgrade @ Golden Mobile Home Park. Started 09/16/2021. We will be upgrading 623' of 1" line changing to 4" PVC. (This area is part of what we purchased from LMPWA back in 2012). To date we have laid 460'. and have 160' remaining. We have 9 of the services out of a total of 14 inside the park + 1 facing HWY 5 N. We have run into a lot of rock while laying this line.
- <u>Dyer Streets/2nd/3rd Streets Phase 1</u> Started 09/08/2021. We will be laying approximately 2500' of 8' SDR 26 PVC and replacing 10 manholes to replace old concrete lines on Dyer street/2nd & 3rd Streets during phase 1. To date we have laid 868' of line and set 4 manholes. Remaining to be completed 1632' of line and 5 manholes. This phase covers dyer street behind hickory park going toward Hwy N. 2nd & 3rd streets and a jaunt up to Ozark surgical center.

\*Phase II of this project that will be starting at manhole behind hickory park going west from where we started on Phase I heading toward 6th street and down 6th street to get lines out of the road and upgrade this section of line. Johnny is working on laying this section of line out now.

Hickory street / Lilian St SL replacement will be started when Dyer is complete. (We will do this before Phase II of Dyer Street.)
We will also be laying new water line on Lilian Street to replace old 2" galvanized water line when we are finished with Hwy 5N WL upgrade.

• We have also started looking at what we are going to have to do on Hwy 5 S as far as relocating water/sewer lines in the state right of way for the new widening of Hwy 5 S starting around the bridge area by oak tree trailer park all the way to the bypass.

## Street Committee Meeting October 19, 2021 – 12:30 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 12:27 p.m.

Present were Arnold Knox, Director of Streets; Jim Bodenhamer and Jennifer Baker, Committee members.

Arnie showed the Committee a spreadsheet of past street rebuilds along with current and scheduled rebuilds for 2022, including their costs. There was discussion of the upcoming overlays that should be completed by the end of November.

The Street Report for September 2021 was reviewed. Arnie reported to the Committee new asphalt has been put down on Burnett Drive which completes this project. Asphalt tickets have yet to be received for a final cost, and as of September 30, 2021, the cost to Burnett Drive is \$560,658.99. Jennifer asked if this will be three lanes like the first part that was rebuilt to Bucher Drive. Arnie said, yes and it will be striped, but will be done when all the overlays are completed so the contractor can complete striping at one time. The Committee complimented the finished three lane street.

Spring Street is another project that has been completed but is waiting for new asphalt to be put down. The cost to Spring Street is \$179,781.04.

Overlays through September 30 totaled \$387,649.42. Arnie told the Committee that Buttercup Drive has been completed, Kentwood Drive in Northern Hills, along with Leisure Lane and the cul-de-sacs along

Driftwood Lane behind Baxter Lab, are scheduled to be overlaid. He said the biggest overlay will be Cardinal Drive from 5 South to Highway 62. He plans on having all old asphalt dug out from Spring Street to 5 South, but the asphalt from Spring Street to Highway 62 will be milled. He added, he was going to publicize a notice about a week before the Cardinal Drive overlay is set to begin. The cost of Overlays this year will be close to \$600,000 but that is because there were no overlays done last year. He said this total cost is two years' worth of overlays.

Jennifer asked if the two construction crews have been combined to one. Arnie said, yes and no. They are combined on one job because he is so short of concrete finishers. It seems when a crew is pouring, at times they need finishers to assist from the other crew, so he put the crew that has completed Spring Street on Demetree, very close to Cooper Street. This way they can go back and forth working concrete and not have to travel across town.

As far as employees, he has three AID employees, and said he and Sue from HR have four interviews this week.

Jim asked if there was a list of contractors to use for striping the streets. He also mentioned he had been asked if South College belongs to the city or if it was still part of the state jurisdiction. Arnie said yes, there are three or four contractors that do striping and added, that part of South College belongs to the city now. Jim said he had gotten a call from a resident telling him the striping on South College has faded and is hard to see. Arnie told the Committee he plans on having that restriped when the rest of the streets are completed towards the end of November. He is going to use a thermoplastic type that has reflector beads in it. This will be highly visible at night.

Continuing with the Street Report, Arnie told the Committee the rebuild of Cooper Street, Louann and Demetree has begun and the total cost to date is \$40,887.02. He said both crews are there, one working on Cooper Street has the culvert completed and are now pouring new curbs to 5 South. The other crew is at Demetree. They have run into some rock to hammer out but it's going well.

Maintenance for the month of September is \$22,018.59 and this cost will go up. He said he was at a meeting this morning with ASU about the Christmas lighting program that is in the works. Jennifer asked what kind of work the Street Department will be doing there and Arnie said mostly bucket truck work. Jim asked how much manpower he will need. Arnie said he plans on having a couple guys starting next week putting displays out. He added, he purchased about 200 pelican totes to store the lights in along with a 20-foot storage container for them. He plans on purchasing another 3 or 4 trailers for the Christmas decoration storage. Jennifer said the new Christmas lights that had been purchased last year for the power poles were very nice and asked when those will be put up. Arnie said those will go up the week of Thanksgiving.

The Budget Summary was reviewed, and Arnie said it looked good. He estimates approximately a \$2.4 million carryover into 2022.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:56 p.m.




